When women flee their homes, their health care should follow. HERA is a refugee-led mobile health platform, giving displaced women access to maternal care through a WhatsApp AI chatbot that speaks their language and understands their cultural realities. HERA creates portable health records that cross borders, provides trustworthy and culturally grounded guidance, and offers care navigation that works on any phone—a chatbot that becomes a lifeline. It has 250,000 users with potential to scale to 300,000 with support from the Frazier Award.

HERA impacts entire communities through accessible technology, leveraging mobile platforms that center on culturally grounded multi-lingual support and provide continuity of care.

reliable transportation to medical care. Low-cost ambulances and partnerships with midwives and community leaders give pregnant women faster, life-saving access to health in 'last-mile' communities. Building on Moving Health's locally grounded and sustainable mission, the Frazier Award supported expansion to new regions, helping to ensure that no woman is left behind in an emergency.

System gaps in health care often mean that timely information and care don't reach women who need it most. ARMMAN bridges this divide by leveraging mobile technology and existing health systems to encourage women with life-saving information during pregnancy and early childhood. outcomes at scale.
